







- 1) Birth of rugby: where and when? It was born in Rugby in the 1800s
- 2) What kind of school made Rugby famous? Rugby was famous for its public school, a private school for upper-class students/pupils.
- 3) What is the legend about the birth of rugby? The legend has it that one day a student named William Webb Ellis picked up the ball and ran with it, giving birth to rugby.
- **4) When were soccer and rugby clearly distinguished?** The two sports were clearly distinguished in the 1860s when the Football Association was created.





1) How long does a rugby match last?

A game of rugby consists of two halves of 40 minutes with a half-time of 10 minutes, with injury time added on at the end of each half.

2) How many players are there in a rugby team?

The game is played with hands and feet and an oval ball, between two teams of 15 players each, plus 7 substitutes.

3) What is the object of the game?

The game consists of catching or picking up the ball and running with it, passing, throwing the ball to another player for scoring points, as well as kicking the ball. In rugby, passes to another team member are always in the back.

To take the ball from the other team, it's also possible to push or shoulder an opponent holding the ball.

The object of the game is to score more points than your opponents.
